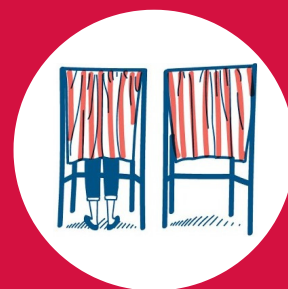

HOW TO REGISTER

You can register to vote on-line:

voterregistration.alaska.gov

Deadline for this year's election is:

October 4, 2020

If you think you may already be registered, but are not sure, check your status: lwvanchorage.org
click: CHECK YOUR VOTER INFORMATION



REQUIREMENTS

You can register to vote if:

- You are a U.S. Citizen and
- You will be 18 within 90 days of completing the on-line form

You will need:

- Alaska Driver's License # or
- Alaska State ID # and
- Social Security Number

If unsure of citizenship status, DO NOT register to vote. If born in the U.S. you are a citizen.



VOTING IN PERSON

Election Day: November 3, 2020

Find your polling location: lwvanchorage.org

click: CHECK YOUR VOTER INFORMATION

Early in-person voting

October 19 - November 2, 2020

Early voting locations:

- Anchorage City Hall, 632 W. 6th Ave.
- Anchorage Midtown Mall
- Eagle River Key Bank (starts 10/27/20)



ABSENTEE VOTING

To obtain an absentee ballot:

elections.alaska.gov

Pay close attention to

- deadlines for applications
- instructions for voting
- deadlines for returning ballots

Absentee ballots must be post-marked by 11/3/20.
OR return your absentee ballot to the ballot drop-box:
State Div. of Elections, 2023 Gambell St.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

If you want to remain an Alaska resident but attend an out-of-state college or are stationed with the military out of Alaska, DO NOT register to vote in another state. Doing so makes you a resident of that state, which means you:

- No longer qualify for a PFD
- Will pay out-of-state fees for fishing and hunting licenses; and
- Will pay out-of-state tuition if you decide to come back to Alaska to finish college.
